Welcome to the Dedicated to Learning (D2L) Summer School Program. We are very pleased to bring our summer school program to Walnut Valley Unified School District students and students in our surrounding districts.

Our goal is to assist students with their academic goals and needs by offering summer courses for *enrichment and acceleration*.

All D2L classes are taught by credentialed teachers, offering a curriculum that meets or exceeds California Content Standards. The D2L site Principal, teachers, and staff are dedicated to providing students with a high quality educational experience. Our program is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

The following information pertains to the D2L Summer School program held on the **Walnut High School Campus**. We hope the following topics will assist you in better understanding our summer school program.

What are the days/hours for summer school?

Classes will be held daily on the Walnut High School campus from 7:30am-1:00pm, on Monday, June 9, 2025 through Thursday, July 17, 2025. This summer, we have one National Holiday (Juneteenth – June 19th) which requires an adjustment to our typical Monday – Thursday schedule.

Classes that are “year-long” (10 Credits) are 6 weeks in length. While a one semester course: Health Online is a 6 week course as many of these students are also taking in-seat courses. The 6 week pacing of this class makes it a manageable option for students taking another summer session course. Classes that are offered through the Edgenuity learning platform and Physical Education are paced by the student.

Summer school is divided into 2 three week sections: The first 3 weeks make up the “1st Semester” of a class with the second 3 weeks making up “2nd semester.” Please review your schedule, planned vacations, and any potential club, sports, and internship schedules closely prior to registering for a class. **We are not able to make**

attendance exceptions or schedule adjustments for athletic events, family travel, or school functions related to participating in your high schools' clubs or competitive athletics.

Dates for 2025 Summer School Session Overview:

Mondays through Thursdays with the following adjustments for the June 19th National Holiday.

Summer Session 2025: June 9 - July 17, 2025* (Monday - Thursday)

*June 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 – *Our 5 day first week includes our make up day for the June 19th holiday.*

*June 16, 17, 18 (Mon, Tues, Wed)

*June 19 (Juneteenth-No School)

*June 23-26 (Monday - Thursday, end of Sem 1)

*2nd Semester of Summer will follow the traditional Monday – Thursday Schedule

DEDICATED TO LEARNING - SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM 2025

We offer two types of courses. The tuition for the summer 2025 session is:

10 Credit Course: \$800

5 Credit Course: \$500

**** Please note: If you take a lab science course (Biology, Chemistry) a \$20 lab fee is added to the class tuition.**

What courses are offered in Summer School at Walnut High School?

We seek to offer a range of science, social science, elective, and mathematics courses for the coming summer session. All courses are subject to sufficient enrollment. If a course is closed due to insufficient enrollment, a full refund will be provided.

Students are responsible for meeting course pre-requisites when completing their applications with D2L. In order for an application to be valid, students agree that they have met said pre-requisite requirements. If it is found that students have not met pre-requisite requirements and have been admitted into a course, they will be dropped from the course without a refund. If you have any doubt about which course to sign up for, please consult your academic counselor at school or email us at whs@dedicated2learning.org prior to completing an application.

- Please note: All courses may not be available at the time of registration. If a course fills to capacity during the first registration window, it will not be offered during the second registration period.

What are the requirements to enroll in *Online courses*?

Our online classes will be completed via the internet through the use of Google Classroom. Students may also be required to complete an ONLINE orientation prior to the start date of their On-line class. Each teacher will provide their process for joining the class to the students. Instructional units and exams will be online and facilitated through the virtual environment. Online courses have set due dates and participation requirements. Online teachers will also have one synchronous session each week. These courses can be completed anywhere students are able to access reliable internet.

Requirements:

1. Complete your Orientation after being assigned to a teacher as appropriate.
2. Maintain access to reliable internet (We cannot make exceptions to course deadlines due to a student's inability to log on).

3. Pick up text book on the WHS campus or you may choose to use an Online version if available. (Your teacher will provide this information in their introductory letter.)
4. Meet login requirements per the course syllabus. It is the student's responsibility to meet all deadlines. All deadlines and expectations are based on the day and time at Walnut High School. Students taking courses while traveling need to ensure they account for web access and time zone differences.

How much does Summer School cost?

The tuition for Summer School classes is \$500 for 5 credits (1 semester), and \$800 for 10 credits (2 semesters).

Why is there a tuition fee for classes?

California's state government does not provide specific funding for enrichment summer school programs to public school districts. As a private, non-profit entity, Dedicated to Learning runs a fee-based summer school program for students in grades 9-12. The tuition for summer school covers the expenses related to running this program, including: cost of teacher and staff salaries, rental of the facilities and classrooms, utility charges, maintenance, material fees, plus the additional mandatory employer costs and other related costs.

What methods of payment do you accept?

During the application process, applicants will be required to submit payment for all courses through the online payment system using a Credit Card, Debit Card or E-Check. Complete instructions for submitting tuition payments will be posted on the application page during the registration process.

Is financial aid available for D2L tuition courses?

No, there is no financial aid available for D2L tuition courses. D2L is a private school and attending courses are a voluntary. WVUSD and surrounding districts do not require students to take tuition based courses. All courses in our program are optional and designed to help students looking for a summer option.

Who can enroll in a D2L Summer School course?

Students currently enrolled in WVUSD schools in grades 8-11 who meet the course prerequisites for acceleration or enrichment, and WVUSD students in grades 9-11 who would like to replace a D or F grade for credit recovery may enroll in the D2L Summer School program during the 1st registration window.

Students currently in grades 8-11 who are NOT currently enrolled in WVUSD schools may enroll in the D2L Summer School program during the 2nd registration window, however, current WVUSD students will receive priority in course enrollment.

How do I apply for a D2L Summer School class?

There will be 2 registration windows for 2024 D2L summer school program. It is to your advantage to register during the 1st Registration Window as any classes which reach capacity and close during the first registration may not be available for the second registration window.

1st Registration Window: The online application will open on February 19th at 6:00pm and must be completed on March 1st at 6am: Confirmations will be posted on the D2L Website on Sunday March 2 at 6pm. *See details below.*

2nd Registration Window: **The 2nd registration window dates will be determined soon.** At this time, it is expected that the 2nd online application will open at 6:00 pm March 17th and must be completed by 11:59 pm on March 28th: Confirmations will be posted on the D2L Website on March 31st at 6pm. See details below.

1st Registration Window INSTRUCTIONS:

All WVUSD 8th-11th graders may complete the online application process for classes during this window.

The online application will be available beginning at 6:00pm, on February 19th and must be completed before the March 1st deadline.

All Applications submitted during the registration window will be considered. THERE IS NO ADVANTAGE TO SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

EARLY, so **DO NOT** feel compelled to apply immediately at 6:00pm on February 21st.

All valid applications submitted during this application window will be processed for available seats. Submission of an application **DOES NOT** guarantee enrollment in a course. Available seats in all courses will be filled according to the following priority criteria in the following order. A lottery that selects applications randomly will be held for all classes receiving more applicants than seats available.

1. Class of 2026 – Current 11th graders enrolled at WHS
2. Class of 2027 – Current 10th graders enrolled at WHS
3. Class of 2028 – Current 9th graders enrolled at WHS
4. Class of 2029 – Current 8th graders enrolled in WVUSD schools
5. WVUSD students not attending WHS
6. Students not currently enrolled in the Walnut Valley district.

Course offerings may change prior to registration and courses may also be cancelled due to insufficient enrollment or staffing. If a course is closed for either of these reasons, a full refund will be provided to the applicant.

TUITION PAYMENTS

During the online registration process you will need to submit your tuition payment using a debit or credit card. Your application will not be complete until your payment has been processed. Complete instructions for submitting tuition payments will be posted on the application page during the registration process.

NOTIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT

A confirmation list of students who have received seats in all courses will be posted on the D2L Summer School Program website on Sunday, March 3rd at 6:00 pm.

2nd Registration Window INSTRUCTIONS

Any seats not filled during the 1st registration window will be made available to any WVUSD or Non-WVUSD student during this window. Expected Date: Online registration for these available seats will open on the D2L website at 6:00pm on March 17th.

As with the first registration window: **THERE IS NO ADVANTAGE TO SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION EARLY**, so **DO NOT** feel compelled to apply immediately. ALL valid applications submitted during this application window will be processed for available seats. Submission of an application **DOES NOT** guarantee enrollment in a course. Available seats will be filled according to the criteria listed above with the addition of allowing students not currently enrolled in WVUSD schools to apply. A lottery will be held for all classes receiving more applicants than seats available. If you are not a student in a WVUSD school, please use your Date of Birth as your ID Number when you apply.

I don't know my student ID number, or don't have one. Where can I find it?

The student ID number is found on your student ID card, transcripts, at the school Counseling Offices, on report cards, or student class schedules.

If you are not a WVUSD student, please use your birth date: Two digits for the day, Two digits for the month and the last Two digits for the year (MM/DD/YY). For example, if you were born on January 1, 1998, your ID would be "010198"

TUITION PAYMENTS

Complete instructions for submitting tuition payments will be posted on the application page during the registration process.

What if I missed the registration dates or did not get into a class?

Students who missed both registration windows, or did not secure a seat in a class, can attempt to add an open seat in a class through a special request form that will be posted on the Walnut HS Dedicated to Learning website on June 1, 2025. Available seats will be filled at that time based on the following criteria, in the following order.

- a. Students who previously had the course and received a D or F.
- b. Class of 2026
- c. Class of 2027
- d. Class of 2028
- e. Class of 2029
- f. WVUSD students not attending WHS
- g. Students outside of WVUSD

***** Payment must be made through D2L office staff for this special admit at WHS.**

Are there any Waiting Lists for classes that are full?

Waiting lists for courses meeting their maximum enrollment will be created on an “as needed” basis. Further details will be provided on the website as necessary.

I have an IEP or 504 plan. Can I enroll in Summer School?

Students with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 plan set up by a California public school district, may apply to the D2L Summer School. However, as a private entity, D2L does not provide the resources to accommodate the provisions of IEPs/504s. Any student/parent seeking to register for summer school does so with the understanding that the provisions in the IEP or 504 Plan will NOT be implemented. As the decision to participate in D2L's summer classes is completely voluntary, all students will be expected to participate and complete the course and its requirements in the same manner as all other students in the class. The pacing of summer school courses is *highly accelerated* and not appropriate for students who require modifications to the curriculum or accommodations like extended time on exams and projects or in class coursework.

If you require accommodations and modifications and summer school, please consult your child's IEP Team / 504 Team or District office staff.

What is your Refund Policy?

If you choose to cancel your registration, for any reason, your tuition, **minus a \$100 handling fee,** will be refunded, **ONLY, if the request is made by email prior to 11:59 p.m. on April 25, 2025.**

We are unable to make refund exceptions for any reason as we are required to commit to classroom use agreements and staff hiring after the April 25, 2025 deadline.

No refunds will be granted for ANY reason after the refund deadline posted above as we will commit your tuition to facility and faculty cost at that point.

If Dedicated to Learning cannot provide you with a seat in a course, a full refund will be provided.

How will I know where my class meets?

Class Rosters will be posted on the D2L website on **Friday, by June 6, 2025 at 6pm.**

What is the attendance policy?

All students MUST attend the first and last day of their assigned Summer School class. If a pre-registered student does not show up on Day 1, he/she will be dropped from the class in order to make room for students seeking to add the class. Any student not in attendance by 7:45 on Day 1 will be dropped so that open seats can be offered to students seeking to add a class.

Any student not in attendance on the last day will not pass the class and/or receive credit.

If students are dropped due to attendance reasons, refunds are not provided.

There are no excused absences in summer school. Students are not allowed more than one (1) absence in any 3-week semester class. Students are not allowed more than two (2) absences when enrolled in a 6 week long-class. Seat time in summer school is critical. Students who exceed these absence limits will be dropped from the course with no credit.

Students are allowed three (3) tardies and will be dropped on the 4th tardy. Due to the pace and compressed time frame of summer courses, timely attendance is mandatory.

Non-WVUSD students must review their school's calendar to ensure that they can meet the attendance requirements, as some schools may not complete their school year prior to June 9th. Please remember you must be present on the first day of summer school.
